



## Gold Coast campus



Located at Bilinga on the southern Gold Coast, the campus features views of the Pacific Ocean from many vantage points.

State-of-the-art health science laboratories include the activities of daily living lab; anatomy and physiology lab; anatomy wet lab; audio lab; manual therapies room; pedorthics manufacturing lab; midwifery birth suite; and nursing labs (clinical and simulation).

A shared services hub provides integrated student services. There are modern learning spaces, lecture theatres and tutorial rooms. Library services and computer labs are available, as well as lounge areas, coffee shop and bookstore.

The SCU Health Clinic provides opportunities for clinical experience for SCU students studying health degrees. It also provides professional allied health services to the general public, students and staff

### Lismore campus



Southern Cross University's Lismore campus occupies 75 hectares of lush, sub-tropical grounds including landscaped gardens and rainforest walkways.

The new Learning Centre, opened in April 2015, features individual and collaborative learning spaces and library materials. The Centre is adjacent to the plaza, home of various food and beverage outlets, Co-op bookshop, banking facilities and student services like UniLife, the Career Development Service, Equity and Diversity and the student support centre where highly trained, friendly staff can help you with all aspects of your enrolment and study.

The SCU Gym and Pool features health and fitness facilities including a heated indoor swimming pool.

For health students, Lismore has an anatomy and physiology lab; anatomy wet lab; biochemistry research lab; biomechanics lab; chemistry lab; exercise physiology lab and weights room; manual therapies room; nursing labs (clinical and simulation); and a sports hall.

The science and engineering precinct provides state-of-the-art facilities while environmental science students access specialised labs and advanced analytical equipment.

Visual arts students use the painting, printmaking, 3D and digital art and design studios. Contemporary music students work in a simulated industry environment housed in a specialised music building with high quality acoustic and recording facilities. Media students work in dedicated production facilities including a newsroom, multi-camera television studio, and digital media production studios.

### Coffs Harbour campus



The Coffs Harbour campus provides a friendly learning environment and contemporary teaching facilities. These include purpose-built nursing laboratories (clinical and simulation); anatomy, physiology and chemistry lab; midwifery birth suite; and psychology labs. There are specialised teaching spaces for education students.

The gathering space in the heart of the campus is the ideal place for student activities or to relax with friends. The recreation hall and fitness centre provide a venue for a variety of sporting activities.

The campus is situated on the southern side of the city, minutes from international standard sporting facilities and the airport. It is part of an education precinct, with the University co-located with North Coast TAFE (a technical and further education facility) and a senior high school.

#### **National Marine Science Centre**

SCU operates the National Marine Science Centre (NMSC) in Coffs
Harbour, on the northern side of the city, in walking distance to
Charlesworth Bay, and adjacent to the Solitary Islands Marine Park, a protected
marine habitat.

The NMSC provides the perfect setting for third-year marine science students and researchers to undertake field work. Facilities include a flow-through seawater system that supplies labs, tank farm, aquarium room and hatchery. The NMSC operates a survey and research vessel, and provides scuba support and analytical and sampling equipment.

SCU's new Sydney location at 5-7 Young Street, is a beautiful heritage-listed building, classified by the National Trust and the State Heritage Register, and one of the few remaining historic mid-19th century structures in Sydney. The former Hinchcliff Woolstore now serves as a reminder of the bustling Circular Quay trading port, which was then the centre of wool trading in NSW.

The Lismore campus has a fully accredited medical practice offering a range of general practitioner and psychology services, with a limited service also available at the Coffs Harbour campus. Gold Coast students access public medical services.

#### Workplace experience to gain work-ready skills

Internships give students the ability to gain work-ready skills and establish networks and industry contacts before graduation. They provide students with the opportunity to gain volunteer workplace experience to supplement the practical skills and the theoretical foundations provided throughout their studies.

#### **Facilities**

The School of Environment, Science and Engineering has an impressive range of teaching and research facilities and resources in the science and engineering precinct at the Lismore campus. Students studying marine science can also access the facilities at The National Marine Science Centre in Coffs Harbour.

Engineering students have access to three research laboratories and two teaching laboratories equipped with state-of-the-art equipment including materials conditioning and testing, concrete structures testing, fluids/hydraulics testing and mechanics and physics.

Environmental Analysis Lab (EAL) provides analytical services for professional consultancy projects and support for postgraduate students. It is accredited by the National Association of Testing Authorities (NATA) and is a member of the Australian Soil and Plant Analysis Council (ASPAC).

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and Remote Sensing Laboratory are specialist laboratories for undergraduate and postgraduate research. Laboratories are equipped with up-to-date hardware and software for image processing and spatial analysis and supporting equipment.

**Scanning Electron Microscopy Unit** is a fee-based service for graduate students and commercial clients.

Science Laboratories are fully equipped with advanced analytical equipment. There are four teaching laboratories for biology, chemistry, geology and aquaculture, along with a herbarium, museum and a special algal culture room.

Resources include general sampling and field equipment, boats and 4WD vehicles, fish and animal sampling, sediment sampler, diving equipment and underwater video recorder, geotechnical and geochemical data collection equipment and a portable weather station and data loggers.

### Degrees which put you in the workplace

All law and paralegal courses offer students an opportunity to participate in a work placement which will count towards their degree. The learning opportunities involved on placement may include attending court, legal and other research, working as part of a legal team, working with clients, managing files, drafting correspondence and other legal documents, and general administrative tasks. The knowledge and experience gained through a practical placement supports students as they work towards the transition to legal practice or to work as a paralegal. Students are responsible for identifying their own placement, which must be approved by the School.

During my studies at the SCU School of Law and Justice I have been given excellent and constant support from the academic and professional staff. In fact my teachers are also great mentors who have never hesitated to listen and offer valuable advice on any issues I have with the subjects. The close teacher-student connection is something I really appreciate. This is such a friendly environment where you can feel confident and inspired to explore different areas of law or further your interest in particular legal topics. Furthermore, the law school and the student law society offered many opportunities (e.g. workshops, seminars, competitions etc.) for students to learn more about - and prepare for - the legal profession and legal practice as well as other occupations beyond (but closely associated with) the law.

Law is a particular field of study where language plays an essential role. So as a non-native English speaker, I first found the study quite challenging; but after plenty of lessons in legal writing and research skills, my English language and communication skills have improved significantly – such is the benefit of consistent practice! I believe the knowledge and skills gained through this course have helped me become better-rounded, more socially-conscious and ready for future employment and study opportunities.



## Important information



### Student visa www.immi.gov.au

To study in Australia you must have a valid Australian visa. Student visas are temporary visas that allow people to come to Australia for a specified period to study at an Australian institution. Visit the Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) website above for further information.

### Student visa conditions

Make sure you are familiar with the conditions of your visa by reviewing the information set out on the DIBP website.

### Financial requirements

You must have sufficient funds to cover all education and living expenses for the duration of your studies. Refer to the 'Student visa living costs and evidence of funds' section on the DIPB website.

### Bringing other family members

You may be eligible to bring family members depending on your visa. School-aged children must be enrolled at school. School fees will vary depending on school, age of child and if you are a scholarship holder. A list of local schools can be found at scu.edu.au/international/apply

### ESOS www.aei.gov.au

The Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) monitor and regulate the higher education sector's involvement with overseas students studying in Australia on student visas. Higher educational providers must meet minimum standards set by TEQSA to enable registration under the ESOS (Education Service for Overseas Students) Act. This protects Australia's reputation for delivering quality education services and the interests of overseas students, by setting minimum standards and providing tuition and financial assurance.

The ESOS Act mandates a nationally consistent approach to registering education providers so that the quality of the tuition and care of students remains high. The professionalism and integrity of the industry is further strengthened by the ESOS Act's interface with immigration law. This imposes visa-related reporting requirements on both students and providers.

The National Code is a set of nationally consistent standards that govern the protection of overseas students and delivery of courses to students by providers that are registered on the Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS).

### CRICOS www.cricos.deewr.gov.au

Higher educational providers in Australia must be registered to enrol overseas students in specific courses. Registered providers have a CRICOS (Commonwealth Register of Institutions for Overseas Students) code and a specific CRICOS course code. This registration guarantees the provider and the course meet the high standards necessary for overseas students.

### Tuition Protection Service www.tps.gov.au

The Tuition Protection Service (TPS) is an initiative of the Australian Government to assist international students whose education providers are unable to fully deliver their course of study. The TPS ensures that international students are able to either complete their studies in another course or with another education provider or receive a refund of their unspent tuition fees.

### **Refunds or deferments**

Refunds (Refunds and Remission Policy) or deferment (Enrolment Deferment, Suspension and Cancellation Procedures – International Students) information can be found in the SCU Policy library. scu.edu.au/policy

### **Tuition fees**

Tuition Fees are listed in the **Offer of Admission** and are correct at the time of issue. They will be subject to an increase each calendar year and students are required to pay the new tuition fee each year.

### **OSHC (Overseas Student Health Cover)**

OSHC is a compulsory medical health insurance for international students studying in Australia. Medibank Private is SCU's preferred provider. For alternative providers, refer to www.health.gov.au and search for 'overseas student cover'.

# **Student Services and Amenities Fee** (SSAF)

The Student Services and Amenities Fee (SSAF) provides Australian universities with additional funds to maintain and improve essential services and amenities of a non-academic nature for students. These funds can be used by universities to focus on student services that will support and enrich the student experience. SSAF is collected following enrolment.
